

Oral Presentation Guideline for ICSRI 2026

The time allocated for a presentation is 15 minutes, with a further 5 minutes allowed for Q&A.

- **Title slide:** should include the title of the abstract, name of the presenter, authors of the paper, and affiliation. [1 slide maximum]
- **Introduction and Problem Statement:** provide an overview of your research topic and its significance. [1 slide maximum]
- **Literature:** brief overview of the relevant literature that frames your research question. Can be key theories, concepts, and previous research findings that informed your study. [1 slides maximum]
- **Methodology:** describe the research methodology, and methods used to conduct your study. be concise about data collection, sampling, and analysis procedures. [1 slide maximum]
- **Results:** present your key findings. Tie it back to your research question and literature/theoretical underpinnings. [2-3 slides maximum]
- **Conclusion:** summarize the main findings and contribution of your study to academic knowledge and/or practice. discuss any limitations of your study and suggest areas for future research. [1 slide maximum]
- **End reference page:** Include all the references you have used for this presentation. [1 slide maximum]

It is recommended to limit number of your slides to 6-8 slides; this would give you enough time to talk about each slide within 15 minutes time limit.

You are required to use the template mailed to you by ICSRI 2026
